YOU MAKE ME FEEL CURATED BY A—Z (ANNE DUFFAU)

Southwark Park Galleries is delighted to invite A—Z (Anne Duffau) to guest-curate a group exhibition with three multidisciplinary artists: **Jeanie Crystal, Zein Majali and Emily Pope**. In association with the 23rd edition of PAF Olomouc – Festival of Film Animation and Contemporary Art 2024, the exhibition presents the second iteration of You Make Me Feel originally displayed at XY Gallery, Czech Republic. Relating to the theme of diaries and self narratives in all forms – including stories, notes, self-reflection, social networks, and periodic writing – You Make Me Feel is a chunk of emotions, a bundle of affects, a note to your future self.

A series of performances and screenings will be programmed for our Dilston Gallery alongside the exhibition at our Lake Gallery, with further details to be announced in 2025.

ART & ECOLOGY SCHOOL RESIDENCIES: THE EXHIBITION

This exhibition celebrates our Public Engagement work in local schools, a popular annual programme bringing free art sessions addressing the themes of environment and climate change through the collective process of art. Our professional Artist Associates spend two weeks in residency at a local primary school, delivering high quality creative and educational sessions with local children.

Exploring the theme of ecology to include marginalised perspectives around how migration has shaped the green spaces around us and beyond, this exhibition presents artworks produced by Year 3 students at **Rotherhithe Primary School**, created with **Kandace Siobhan Walker**, and Year 5 students at St James' CE Primary School, created with **Anne Ogazi**.

Partnering with our local neighbours and heroes: the Bede Centre for those with learning disabilities, Southwark Park Galleries will host a series of weekly art workshops for Bede clients in our Dilston Gallery Parish Room overlooking the park. Over the course of 2-3 months the participants will work towards creating an exhibition to be displayed in our Lake Gallery Salter Space committed to community focused projects. A special place for people with learning disabilities, Bede Centre does amazing work to develop skills, expand friendships and help people. This will be the first time artwork created by participants will be showcased in a dedicated exhibition.

Faigh Amach (Discover) is a new initiative by Temple Bar Gallery + Studios, Dublin, in partnership with Culture Ireland and Southwark Park Galleries, London, to support an Irish artist in presenting their first international solo exhibition in 2026. Visual artists living in the 32 counties in Ireland or Irish artists living abroad who have not yet had a solo international exhibition or major exhibition outside of Ireland are invited to apply. Three artists will be selected from the open call to participate in a group exhibition at Temple Bar Gallery + Studios, 31 July - 21 September 2025. Then one of these three exhibiting artists will be invited to present their first international solo exhibition in spring 2026 at Southwark Park Galleries, London.

She is a Tutor at the Royal College of Art's Contemporary Art Practice Programme and works as a freelance producer/researcher for Somerset House Studios. She produces monthly shows on Resonance FM and stegi. radio and live music under Alpha through several projects and collaborations (MAENADS, Polisonics, The New Adolescents). Her latest project was hosted at Matt's Gallery (May-Sept 2024) and is an ongoing series titled: Always Coming Home.

PAF

PAF also has a publishing line (PAF Edition) and moving image distribution platform. In the past two decades, PAF has evolved into a label comprising an international network of artists, curators and events. The initial frameworks of the platform have been relations between film animation, visual art and music as well as moving image in film and video. Along with the accelerated development of audiovisual art in the past two decades, PAF has expanded its focus, embodying phenomena aligned with virtual space, performative art, game design and fashion.
